Students entering Third Grade are required to read *Stuart Little* by E.B. White. Students may read it independently, read it with an adult, or have an adult read it to them.

After reading *Stuart Little*, you will create a poster.

Directions: You will be creating a poster that will make other people want to read *Stuart Little*.

Materials:

1. Flat Poster board (color of your choice, no foam board please)
2. Pencil
3. Markers
4. Any other decorations that you would like to include

Items that your poster should include:

1. A title.
2. A paragraph about your favorite (or most exciting) part of *Stuart Little*. Remember you are trying to convince other people to read *Stuart Little*.
3. An illustration of your favorite part of the book.
4. An illustration of the main characters.
5. Your name.

You may include anything else on your poster that you think will make other people want to read the book. The poster should be neat and creative! I look forward to seeing your posters on the first day of school!
